

The food packets were distributed from day one of lockdown, i.e. on March 23, 2020 to May 3, 2020. More than 40,000 people were fed during this lockdown period.

5. T O OVERCOME THE CHALLENGES

6. DISTRIBUTION OF GROCERY KITS

11. A HAPPY HOME FOR THE STRANDED



Around 350 students studying in Suttur school, belonging to Eastern states and Northern districts of Karnataka, who could not return to their homes due to lockdown were accommodated at Sri Suttur Mutt. Many parents who had come to take their children back to their homes were also stranded here, they were also accommodated at Sri Suttur Mutt by providing food and medical care.



12. ALL SET TO FIGHT



JSS Hospital is a 1800-bed tertiary care hospital with experienced doctors, paramedical and supporting staff. The hospital and staff are following the guidelines laid by the Government of India to tackle Corona virus. A flu clinic was started during the last week of February 2020, to screen the patients. An isolation ward with 10 beds and 10 ICU beds were kept ready to treat the patients. Hundreds of patients were kept in quarantine and among them 2 tested positive for Corona virus, who were later shifted to the District COVID Hospital.

A provision for telephonic consultation was also arranged in the JSS Hospital,

Mysuru, for those who were unable to reach the hospital due to the lockdown.

Ambulance services were working 24/7 during the lockdown to carry COVID-19 patients to the hospital.

Principal, faculty members, and students of the JSS Institute of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences, Coimbatore, also have sent their willingness to serve as volunteers in the COVID-19 pandemic containment programme, to the Director of Indian System of Medicine and Homeopathy, Chennai. Around 150 members from the institution have expressed their wish to serve.

13. A PROMISING GENERATION



During this tough period, the students of various JSS institutions came forward to help the people in distress, through their humble contributions and innovative ideas.

In a short period of time, it has turned as Mysuru's No.1 grocery delivery portal. In the lockdown period, they delivered essentials to more than 2,000 houses. Yogitha, Lohith Reddy, Bhaskar Lakshmi Narayan, Vivek, Vysakh and M.P. Suresh are the initiators behind "www.mysurumarket.in"

and hospitals. The members of the Samsthan also distributed grocery kits to labourers and slum dwellers. Along with this, they also contributed PPE kits to the corona warriors of JSS Hospital, Mysuru.



15. REVIEWING THE FUNCTIONING

Even during the lockdown, classes were not interrupted in our institutions. Our teachers were conducting online classes, online tests, quiz and even competitions like paper presentation to keep the students

engaged. HH Jagadguru Sri Shivarathri Deshikendra Mahaswamiji reviewed the functioning of these institutions at regular intervals by connecting to the heads of various JSS institutions.



16. CONTRIBUTIONS OF KRISHI VIGNAN KENDRA

The Krishi Vignan Kendra (KVK) at Suttur was with the farmers during the entire lockdown period. The JSS ICAR KVK was working with just 30 percent staff, who were providing awareness about the disease to the farmers. The

members of KVK went to the nearby villages of Suttur and gave suggestions on crop growth. They also prepared 30 litres of sanitizers using neem as the main ingredient and supplied it to the Suttur Math and other JSS institutions.



17. CONTRIBUTIONS OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION DIVISION

The institutions under the Department of Technical Education of the JSS Mahavidyapeeta conducted various activities for the well-being of people during the COVID-19 period.

A team under the guidance of Prof. P. Mallu prepared alcohol-based hand sanitizer at the laboratory of

Department of Chemistry. The sanitizer was produced with natural extracts as per the standards prescribed by the World Health Organisation. The hand sanitizer was launched by Dr. C. G. Betsurmah, Executive Secretary, and Sri S. P. Manjunath, Secretary-1 of JSSMVP. It was supplied to the various JSS institutions.



Compassion towards animals

A group of students of the SJCE had voluntarily taken up the initiative of feeding the stray dogs on their college campus. Sumukh D. B., Manisha C. A.,

and Nidharsh Raj K., Department of Construction Technology and Management are feeding the animals regularly since the beginning of the lockdown period.

'Campus Companions' are fed too



Myuru, Apr. 10 (SHR): Two SJCE students, who are busy with online classes that the institution is providing, have a reason to visit their campus every



day even when the institution is shut. They come there to feed the hungry dogs. As the educational institutions are closed for long time now, stray dogs which used to get food from the eateries in the SJCE campus and around the premises are starving with no students to feed them.

Sumukh Bharath and Manisha, 4th year students of Construction Technology and Management, SJCE, Myuru, are making sure that their campus companions are not left hungry. Speaking to SOM, Sumukh said: "There are about 30-35 dogs in the College campus. Since there is scarcity of food to them due to closure of College, we started to feed them from last week."

Asked about their expenses, he said: "We require at least

7-8 kg of dog food at once. Initially, we did it ourselves, feeding them once in a week but as lockdown situation might continue and to keep our initiative going, we requested people to support us through social media and we got good response to continue."

"We had planned for two times a week, but with increasing number of contributors we are planning to feed them on alternate days till May end," they added.

- The Department of Chemistry, JSS Academy of Technical Education, Bengaluru, prepared 20 litres of sanitizers and supplied to the public.
- The students and staff of JSS Academy of Technical Education, Noida, have been actively involved in production and supply of masks and sanitizers to the needy. Food kits were also distributed by the staff of the institution to those who were struggling to tackle hunger.
- The production centres of JSS Polytechnic for Women, Mysuru, has been producing face masks

which are required for the sister institutions of JSS MVP. As of now, there is a need for 15,699 masks, which will be distributed to the public and staff of JSS institutions.

- At JSS ITI, Tandya, Nanjangud, masks are being producing in the production units. As of now, more than 8,200 masks have been prepared at the centre.
- At the production centre of JSS ITI, Chamarajanagar, more than 7,800 masks are being manufactured and these will be distributed to the staff and students of various JSS institutions.



- SJCE-STEP, Mysuru in collaboration with Wheeler Cleaner Organisation distributed 2000 bottles of sanitizers and masks to the staff of Mysuru City Corporation, Police department

and Hospitals. Also, meals were served to 3000 people every day by an NGO called Let's Do It Mysuru and we supported them raising the fund for the cause.

- An incubate of SJCE- STEP (M/s METI), developed IR thermal non-contact measurement device in 24 hours with his team. It was presented before the District commissioner, Mysuru, and District Health Officers. The efforts were appreciated by Mysuru DC and directed to procure a few devices.





- An incubate of SJCE-STEP (M/s MDBS Tech Pvt. Ltd) had supported the Mandya District Police

Department in developing an APP for issuing digital passes to the travellers.

COVID 19 Ayurvedic Tips to Boost Immunity

Simple Ayurvedic Procedures

Nasal application – Apply sesame oil/ coconut oil or ghee in both the nostrils (Puramash Kayya) in the morning and evening.

Oil Pulling therapy – Take 1 table spoon sesame or coconut oil in mouth. Do not drink, instead rinse for 2 to 3 minutes and spit, followed by warm water rinse. This can be done once or twice a day.



A team under the leadership of Neonatologist Dr. Srinivas Murthy have innovated low cost Biomedical devices to combat COVID-19. Isolation ICU on wheels, Low-cost Ventilator,

Multi-mode Air Sanitizer and handheld UV Surface Sanitizer are the low cost technologies jointly developed by JSS AHER and Ideas Unlimited, Mysuru.

Patients give drive-by salute to Mysurean doctor in US

Mysuru: Dr. Uma Rani Madhusudhan, a physician at the MedStar Medical Centre of South Windsor Hospital in Connecticut, US, and an alumna of JSS Medical College in Mysuru, was in the headlines across the globe on Tuesday after she was honoured in front of her house with a drive-by parade of her patients who had recovered from Covid-19.
